10.50—11.20 Introduction

This introduction will consider how an understanding of contemporary clothing is a vital research tool, enhancing portrait interpretation by providing contextual information on the sitter and his or her contemporary world.

11.20—12.15 Identifying fabrics in portraiture using surviving eighteenth-century examples from the School's collection

During this session, delegates will make a fabric sample card to keep as a point of future reference.

12.15—13.00 Understanding layers

A discussion and demonstration of the seen and unseen layers of male and female clothing.

13.00-14.00 Light lunch provided for delegates

14.00—14.45 Reading the signs

A series of case studies demonstrating how to decode British portraits for indications of the sitters' social status and profession, as well as portrait dating.

14.45—15.15 A practical session

15.15—15.40 Refreshments

15.40—16.30 Costume and light

A dressing demonstration allowing delegates to consider the effect of daylight and authentic beeswax candlelight on eighteenth-century costume, and how that relates to costume depictions in portraiture.

16.30 Close and evaluation

Due to the practical demonstrations and participatory elements of the workshop, delegate places at this event are limited.
